Stations of the cross in the news of the world.





We are in the season of Lent. (Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which falls 40 days prior to Easter. Sundays are not included in the count of these days, as each Sunday is a "little Easter", meant to celebrate resurrection)

I wonder where does your mind go when you hear the word 'Lent'.

Do you think of giving up good things, restricting fun and living a less vibrant life?

Do you think observing Lent is a Roman Catholic tradition we in the United Church want to pay less attention to?

Full disclosure, I am a passionate Lent person, and no, I don't have Roman Catholic roots, but in thanksgiving for shared Christian practices do celebrate the liturgical calendar with all its seasons.

Traditionally, Lent invites us to honour the spiritual practices of prayer, almsgiving and fasting. 

## **GOD'S MISSION OUR GIFTS**

#### MISSION & SERVICE

As February draws to a close, I am pleased to share the 2023 contributions for Mission and Service. We would like to thank all the Communities of Faith who forwarded their contributions on time allowing our finance team to provide us with these numbers earlier than in previous years. We would also like to express our heartfelt appreciation for the ongoing and generous support you have given to Mission and Service.

There is good news to report. The Mission and Service contributions by Congregations, UCW and Special Donations all exceeded budget and the totals for these three areas, sitting at \$17,090,056, were slightly over the 2022 actuals of \$17,062,694. In addition, out of the 19 regions, only one was under the 2022 contributions and that was by a small amount.

The amounts raised for Mission and Service from Direct Gifts, Foundation Gifts and Legacies were below budget, as well as below the 2022 actual amounts. The total for these three areas in 2023 was \$3,741,507, which was below the 2022 actuals of \$4,069,520.

For this initial report, the total for Mission and Service from these areas was \$20,831,564. This compares favourably to the total budget of \$20,225,000, and is close to the 2022 actual amount raised of \$21,132,213.

A final figure, that will include additional Mission and Service elements, will be provided in June in the Accountability Report. At that point the financial audit will be complete and final amounts will be allocated to the Strategic Plan elements.

I would like to thank all of you for your efforts in 2023. It was the first year that could reasonably be called 'post-pandemic' and many things have changed. Your commitment to Mission and Service funding means that the programs can continue and the families and children that need our support can continue receiving it.

Disbursements have been made to The Broom Tree Foundation Ltd., Central Alberta Women's Emergency Shelter and the Mission and Service Fund - Palestine Fund as approved at the annual general meeting in late January.

The congregational portion of \$1,150.00 has been carried over to next year as there was no motion to dedicate the funds.

Already in 2024, we have received \$2,700.00 in new donations to The Legacy Fund that have been deposited.

As well, ideas to use the carry over \$1,150.00 and eligible new funds this year have been received. Ideas include: to assist worship with resources for the 100th anniversary of the United Church in 2025, perhaps purchase a tree to be planted for future Light Up The Night evenings and costs for a new church directory in 2025.
